2. Page 24, line 5: substitute "c)" for "b)".
3. Page 24, line 6: substitute "d)" for "c)".
4. Page 30, line 10: after the colon insert: "a) the village of Shorewood Hills; and b)".

The maps and statistical analysis correctly reflect the contents of Assembly Districts 54 and 77.
